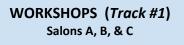

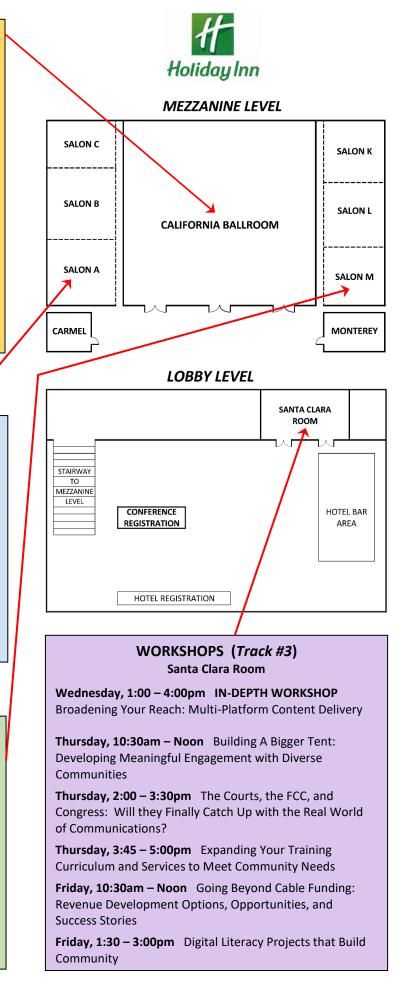

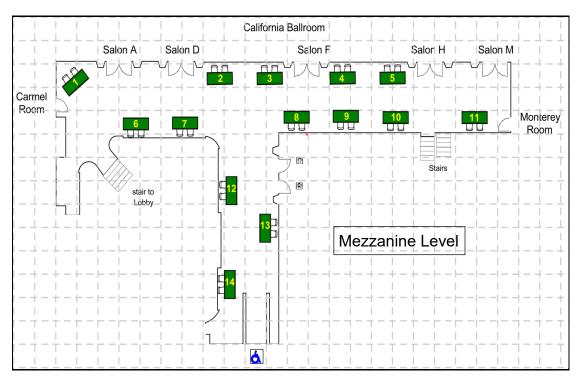

On-Line Community Engagement: New Tools and Tactics Salons A. B. C

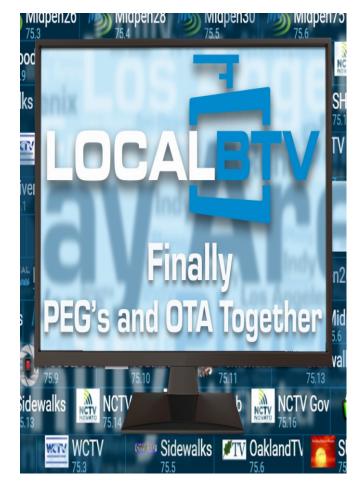
