ARPA Process & Ask

- ◎ \$325k for hybrid meeting build out and personnel for 2022
- ◎ \$6 million request for tech equity, digital divide work, and ongoing Town AV support
- ◎ Increase % of the franchise fees



ARPA Proposal

- © Developed over six months, with input of many partners, town staff, board members, etc.
- © Joined Community Foundation's Community Engagement Meetings about ARPA & asked other grantees for input & collaboration
- © Future planning out six years
- © Intentionalizing our strategic communications
- © Building a community-wide campaign

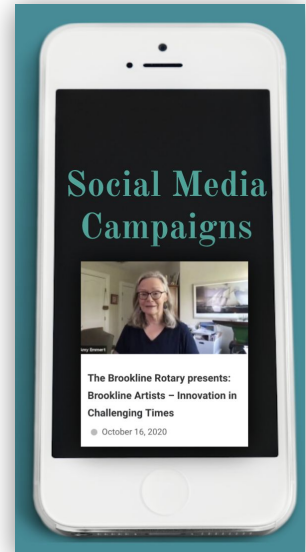

It creates a community media working group
to aid in identifying potential stable funding mechanisms for BIG
in collaboration with the Town.

We want to thank the Town for their long-term partnership and support!

In the COVID emergency, the Town and BIG have successfully partnered to:

- Ensure all government in Brookline is transparent
- Prioritize community engagement and amplifying local voices

The Town allocated \$196,000 to BIG in the first months of COVID in recognition of the critical role that BIG played. They recognized that it was **not sustainable without financial help from the Town.**

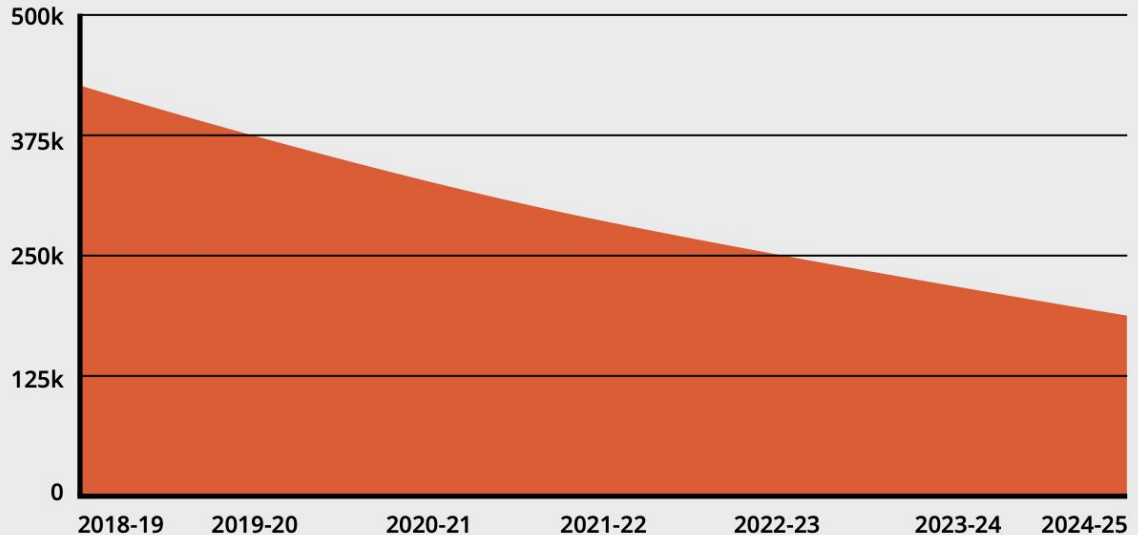
The Problem WA40 Solves

Funding model BIG has had for 30+ years is going away

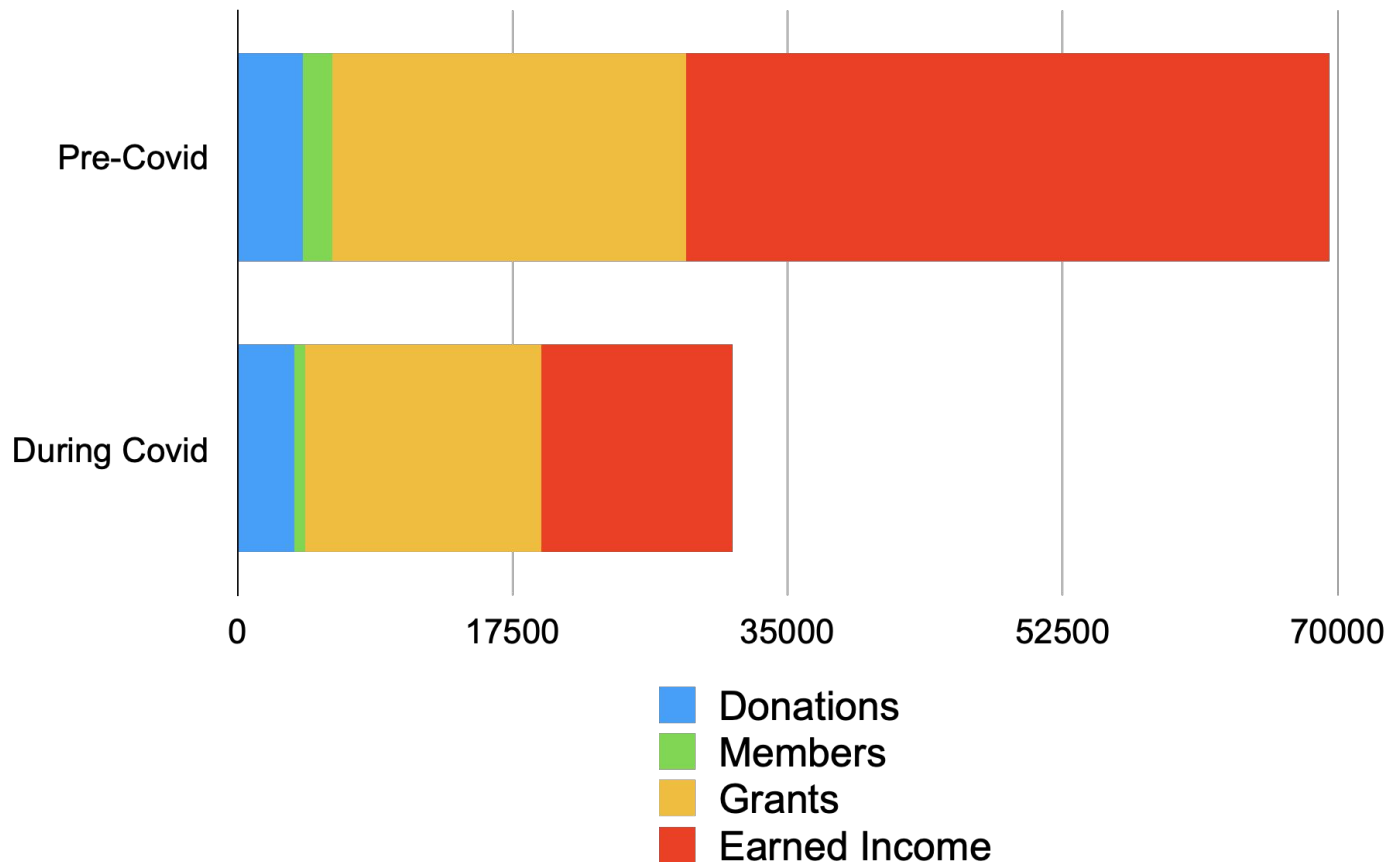
- © BIG presently receives 2% of the 5% of per-subscriber cable fees allowable under federal cable franchise law.
- © Both the Town and BIG are losing **funding** with the precipitous decline in these cable fees due to cable “cord cutters” & streaming services.
- © Comcast revenue is declining by **12.5%** annually
- © RCN revenue is declining annually by **14%**

BIG projects losing HALF its funding by 2025

BIG's ARPA Proposal

Support BIG's Covid-19 Losses & Lost Opportunities While Serving as Essential Workers

Recover from the Covid-19 pandemic while preserving new services and increased community media content, partnerships with nonprofits and training. Cover pandemic losses related to essential worker pay; equipment purchases necessary to go remote and manage cable and live-streaming channels; short-term expenses; and current pandemic-related needs and services.

Future Government Services

- © Ensure that government meeting coverage continues at pandemic levels, meeting the increased expectations of residents and town decision makers. Fund increased cost to cover and support government and some school-related services, knowing that there will be no return to pre-pandemic community needs.
- © Meet the need for government services and capital upgrades, pandemic-related (continued) losses, and five-year technology upgrades for hybrid and capital equipment used by Town, school government, and Town committees through December 2026.



Tech Equity, Community Programs & Broadband Access

Provide staffing and programming for strategic partnerships that support Townwide goals around community engagement, racial and digital equity, media arts education, out-of-school time programs and workforce development. Deliver increased community media arts education and digital equity programs to Brookline's underserved residents and to provide equipment and training.

Provide staff and programs that support Town's racial equity, community engagement, and civic participation goals through collaboration and partnership with Town Meeting Members, CDIC, and community groups.

Support municipal fiber research and development of increased, equitable access to broadband throughout the Town for low-income residents, in partnership with Brookline Broadband's ARPA proposal and future community efforts.
